Last Thursday and Friday, I attended the Department of Education and Training's (DET), Regional forum. The focus of the event was on Teaching Reform and the importance of High Impact Teaching Strategies. DET also introduced the Literacy and Numeracy Strategy, which falls under the 'Excellence in Teaching and Learning' improvement initiative of FISO (Framework for Improving School Outcomes). I found the forum very encouraging in that our current Annual Implementation Plan and school improvement agenda is 'on point' with DET, and that our goals around building the skills and capacity of our teachers and support staff is key to further improving outcomes for our students here at JCPS.

Our Library/Music building has been out of use since the middle of last term due to major water leaks. We have finally received notification from DET that they will be commencing site restoration works to the building. I have received a scope of works that involves the main Library/Music Rooms and Staff/ICT Office. These works are proposed to begin in the holidays beginning July 1<sup>st</sup> 2017.

You will be aware by now that students' mid-year learning progress reports are being sent home this Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June. Your child's report is also accompanied by your child's 'Learning Portfolio'. Please spend some time with your child for them to present and discuss their progress with you. The portfolio must then be returned at your Parent / Teacher interview next Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June. The students will not be required to attend the interview.

Our final assembly for Term Two will be held next Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June. We will be presenting our 'Student of the Term' awards, along with the winners of the Mystery Reward. As a special treat, we will be drawing double the amount of places than usual for this term.
