2019 YEAR 7 PLACEMENTS

INQUIRY LEARNING

Inquiry Learning for Term Three is based on Economics and Business with a focus on designing a stall for the Mini Fete. The Year 5/6 topic is 'Money Matters'. The children will undertake a project to develop their critical thinking skills, knowledge and understanding of the topic. The aim of the project is to develop independent research skills, including planning, creating and managing a successful stall.

INTERSCHOOL SPORT



Interschool Sport begins on Friday July. Details of the fixture were sent home in the last week. All Year Six students will participate. Year Five students will participate on a rotational basis. Students will compete against local schools in Volleystars, Basketball, AFL9s, Sofcrosse and Softball. Emphasis will be placed on participation, teamwork and enjoyment.

HOMEWORK PROGRAM

Students will continue to receive Homework on Monday and are expected to have this completed and returned by Friday each week.
